1.The Invitation

Matthew 11:28-30

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and bumble in heart and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

Consecration: Preparation and Surrender

Spiritual Direction Exercise

Silence

Take a few moments to become still, settling into this time and space of prayer Silence

Awareness

Become aware of the loving presence of the Trinity here, now. the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are with, around, and within you. *Silence*

Reflection

Mark 10:21: Jesus looked at him and loved him Imagine Jesus looking at you, and loving you. Silence How do you feel as Jesus looks at you and loves you? Silence

May God bless you to experience, always, Jesus' long and loving gaze upon you.

Posturing Liturgy

Leader:

Know that the Lord has set apart the godly ones for himself; the Lord will hear when I call to him. Stand in awe and do not sin. And when you are on your beds, search your hearts and be silent.

Response:

Lord, we come to you in awe and in silence - to search and to be searched. You hear us when we call to you.

Leader:

You are the Light of the World. Bring your sacred light to the depths of our souls. Illumine the dark enclaves and every empty cavern. Where there is darkness, let there be light.

Response:

You are the light that warms our hearts. You are the flame that burns within. In your light we see light. We surrender to the light of your grace and mercy. Fill us with your holy presence. Set us apart for yourself. Consecrate us for your glory. Amen.

Moments of Silence

2. Anchoring Reflection: "Come to Me"

Focus:

As we have been collectively preparing for and anticipating these 10 days together as a National Family, we sense that we are to lean into the words of Jesus found in Matthew 11:28–30 as our primary focus – "The Great Invitation". This 'Great' passage is set in the context of two other 'Great' passages often referred to in the gospel of Matthew. We will soak ourselves in a different translation of this text every two days, along with a quotation from Tish Harrison Warren's beautiful book Liturgy of the Ordinary: Sacred Practices in Everyday Life (IVP 2019)

The first passage, the Great Commandment postures us to love God and love people as a lifestyle. The second passage, the Great Commission positions us in a missional mindset for making disciples of Jesus. It's the third passage, **the Great Invitation**, which describes a way of daily living that welcomes the strength, wisdom, and guidance of Jesus to carry out the first two. As we consecrate ourselves to the Lord, bringing our true selves to Him together, we say "Come Holy Spirit."

Scripture

The Great Commandment, Matthew 22:37-40

Jesus replied, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments."

The Great Commission Matthew 28:18-20

Jesus came and told his disciples, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

The Great Invitation, Matthew 11:28–30 (NLT)

Then Jesus said, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you. Let me teach you, because I am humble and gentle at heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light."

Reflect

What might it look like for you today to respond to the invitation of Jesus "Come to me?"

Quote

"Rich Mullins, one of my favorite writers and musicians, said that when he was a kid he'd walk down the church aisle and be "born again again" or "rededicate" his life to Christ every year at camp. In college he'd do it about every six months, then quarterly; by the time he was in his forties it was "about four times a day." Repentance is not usually a moment wrought in high drama. It is the steady drumbeat of a life in Christ and, therefore, a day in Christ."
